

Dear pastors and praying friends,

November was so busy that I will simply save time and space and get right to it.

Salvations

We have had 4 people saved at the church since August, but none more special to me than that of our daughter Isabella. She was saved one Sunday after church. God had been working in her heart for over a year now, and it is so wonderful to see her finally make the decision to trust Christ.

Alex, a man in our church, brought a young man named Levin (*in the white shirt*) to church back in September, and Levin has been attending on and off since then. He wanted to get involved, which led to a conversation about the requirements for that—beginning with salvation. He had been "religious" but had never believed on Christ, and he was saved one Friday night this month. It was so exciting to see Alex taking pictures of Levin playing the piano at church. He looked like a proud grandfather (which he is, seeing as he's the one who brought Levin to the church where he got saved).



Evangelism

We had our first outreach breakfast as a church this month, (see picture on the right) and it was a great success. We had 11 adults and 4 kids come out for breakfast and then head out to evangelize. Two groups went door to door, and another went to a park and did an evangelistic program there. I love seeing Christians be intentional about evangelism. It is good to evangelize passively (those we naturally meet as we live our lives), but it is also good to intentionally take time to engage strangers with the purpose of sharing the gospel.



Baptisms

We baptized two men this month, both of whom were saved at the church. Alex has been attending for about two years now. He has been saved, baptized, and discipled, and is now discipling others in the church. Paul came back in August, got saved, and has also finished his basic discipleship study. He has a 12-year-old son, Elias, who is not yet saved, and it is a thrill to see Paul nudging him to pay attention in church when I am preaching on salvation. All parents should actively pursue the salvation of their children.



Discipleship

We had several people graduate from their basic discipleship this month, (you can see them with their diplomas in the picture) which is exciting, but even more exciting is that I only discipled 2 of the 7. Hannah finished with 3 ladies, I finished with 2 men, and Alfredo and Bastian (both saved, baptized, and discipled at the church) discipled the other 2 graduates.



Building

We have had two buildings fall through, but God is good and has provided a third option, and we are so close to having enough to buy it. We need about \$17,000 more to purchase the building, which is phase 1 of a two-part plan. The second part is converting the house into a church, but right now our main focus is raising the remaining amount to buy the property outright. Please pray for the Lord to provide this soon and to open doors for it! In November, we had over \$17,000 come in, and we are so close to meeting this threshold.
